FYS COURSE Section D “Scientific Modeling for Sport”

New this year are many new Intellectual Engagement Experiences (IEE's) to be selected over the summer, and a virtual-reality social-networking experiment -- with Art/Architecture and community development (5% of course grade). This course is a Mind, Body, Spirit course built around the sport, Art, and philosophy of Judo. A "lab fee" of **\$145 WRITTEN TO JOSEPH WUNDERLICH IS NEEDED THE WEEK BEFORE CLASSES** so I can order Judo Gi's and enroll you in the United States Judo Association. Note that when I originally taught this course I required \$200 of course texts that I've now synthesized into on-line lectures and handouts, so the only required text is now a very inexpensive Judo philosophy book.

For our virtual-reality social-networking experiment, **you need to spend ~\$26 to establish a Minecraft account here: <http://www.minecraft.net/> and give yourself the user name FYSlastname** -- one continuous string of characters using small letters (no Caps) for your last name. The server we will be on is at IP address **174.54.14.202** -- a private whitelisted server that I run, and that you're now a member of. You'll begin with the rank of "Guest" with no building abilities until you're promoted after proving some beginning server etiquette. When you enter the server, read the signs in the bulletin-board building in world 1 ("world") to see where to go. I hope to see you in this virtual world over the summer.
